YOU. Packets of information being provided by the Village Clerk of Hebron as a courtesy to prospective candidates. Information and suggested forms are also available on the Illinois State Board of Elections website at www.elections.il.gov. It is important to note that Nominating Petition papers are subject to legal challenge by objectors if improperly completed. The Electoral Board holds hearings to consider and resolve these objections. However, please be advised that the Village Clerk and staff are not able to provide legal opinions to individuals regarding their petition papers. Prospective candidates are encouraged to consult their own legal advisors on questions related to qualifications for office, preparation of petition papers, circulator requirements, signature requirements, etc., because once the petition papers are officially filed, they cannot be changed or amended.

NUMBER OF SIGNATURES REQUIRED ON PETITIONS FOR NOMINATIONS OF INDEPENDENT CANDIDATES FOR OFFICE

Established Party Candidates: Ballots Cast (highest # within party) x.5% (.005) of the qualified primary electors of their **party**. For political subdivisions, the number of primary electors shall be determined by taking the total vote cast for the candidate for that political party who received the highest number of votes in the political subdivision at the last regular election at which an officer was regularly scheduled to be elected from that subdivision.

Independent Candidates: Ballots Cast x 5% = minimum

Ballots Cast x 8% = maximum (or 50 more than the minimum)

REQUIREMENTS FOR CANDIDACY

- Must be a qualified/registered voter
- One-year residency in the Village of Hebron. (The residency is effective from the date the individual takes office. Newly elected officials would be seated in May of 2025.
- Must not be in arrears in the payment of any tax or other indebtedness due the municipality.
- Must not have been convicted in any court in the United States of any infamous crime, bribery, perjury, or other felony.

PETITION REQUIREMENTS

Nominating petitions must be signed by qualified and registered voters of the Village.

The street number and street name must also be given for each person who signs the petition.

The petition circulator must sign a sworn statement (in front of a Notary Public) on the bottom of each petition that the signatures on the petition were signed in their presence, that the residents are correctly stated, and that, to their knowledge, those persons signing the petition are registered voters.

FILING PERIOD is November 12 – November 18, 2024.

Monday, November 18, 2024, 1:00 p.m. – 6:00 p.m. Filing ends at 5:00 p.m.

WHEN FILING NOMINATING PEITITONS WITH THE VILLAGE CLERK'S OFFICE, THE FOLLOWING COMPLETED DOCUMENTS MUST BE TURNED IN:

- 1. Statement of Candidacy
- 2. Nominating Petition Sheets
- *Receipt for filing a statement of economic interest.

 The Statement itself is filed with the County Clerk of McHenry County.

 The statement must be filed during the calendar year in which the nominating petitions are filed, and it must be filed no later than 5:00 p.m. on the last day for filing the petitions. The receipt must be provided to the Village Clerk by 5:00 p.m. on November 18, 2024.
- 4. Loyalty Oath (optional)

^{*}Election law states that failure to file a "statement of economic interest," within the prescribed time, shall result in ineligibility for, or forfeiture of, office.
