

**CHAPTER 1  
STREETS**

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6B-1-1        EXCAVATIONS *Ord. 39, 10-6-58*

Any person seeking to excavate in the streets and alleys within the corporate limits of the Village shall make application for such excavation to the Village President or his agent on forms provided for such purpose the by Village. Such application shall set forth the purpose and location of the excavation, the size of the opening to be made and the approximate length of time the excavation will remain open. Such application shall be accompanied by statements from all public utility companies furnishing gas, electric, telephone, water, sewer and other public services that they have been informed of the proposed excavations and that arrangements have been made to protect underground structures.

Upon approval of the application by the Village President or his agent, the applicant shall enter into an agreement with the Village and make the required cash bond to guarantee prompt and satisfactory performance of the excavation and the proper backfill, barricading, protective lighting, resurfacing and removal of unused materials.

The application and a copy of the agreement shall be made a part of the public records of the Village.

6B-1-2        DUMPING ASHES IN STREETS *Ord. 10-14-07; and. 1978 Code*

It shall be unlawful for any person to dump or strew ashes in or upon any street in the Village.

6B-1-3        PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY *Ord. 399, 5-6B-85*

The definitions for purposes of this Section are as follows:

Roadway right of way is defined as those areas existing or acquired by dedication or by fee simple for highway purposes; also, the areas acquired by temporary easement during the time the easement is in effect;

Project right of way is defined as those areas within the project right of way lines established jointly by the Village and the State which will be free of encroachments except as hereinafter defined.

6B-1-4        PENALTY *Ord. 399, 5-6B-85*

Any person, firm or corporation violating 6B-1-3 shall be fined not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$500.00 for each offense and a separate offense shall be deemed committed for each and every day during which a violation continues or exists.

6B-1-4        STREET NAMES *Ord. 463 1-16-89*

A.        Hereafter the streets in the Village of Hebron shall be named as follows:

B.        Hereafter, any streets created or annexed to the Village shall be designated as follows:

North-South ways shall be STREETS  
East-West ways shall be AVENUES.

C.        All names of future roadways, whether annexed or newly created by the Village, shall be approved by the Village Board.

D.        The Village Engineer is hereby directed to correct the zoning map in accordance with the above change.

6B-1-6        PEDESTRIAN USE OF STREETS *06-07-784*

A.        Where a sidewalk is provided and its use is practicable, it shall be unlawful for any pedestrian to walk along and upon an adjacent roadway.

B.        Where a sidewalk is not available, any pedestrian walking along and upon a highway shall walk only on a shoulder, as far as practicable from the edge of the roadway.

- C. Where neither a sidewalk nor a shoulder is available, any pedestrian walking along and upon a highway shall walk as near as practicable to an outside edge of a roadway, and, if on a two-way roadway, shall walk only on the left side of the roadway.
- D. Except as otherwise provided in this Code, any pedestrian upon a roadway shall yield the right-of-way to all vehicles upon the roadway.
- E. Any person violating this Section shall be fined \$25.00 for each offense.
