9-2-1 NO PARKING PLACES, *amended 23-24-1018*

- A. It shall be unlawful for the operator or the registered owner of a vehicle to park, or permit the parking of, any vehicle in opposition to the direction of travel on the side of the street on which the vehicle is parked, or a distance of more than 12 inches from the curb, or in any of the following places, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the direction of a policeman or traffic signal.
1. In any marked no-parking zone.
  2. In any intersection.
  3. In a crosswalk.
  4. Upon any bridge or viaduct, or in any subway or tunnel or the approach thereto.
  5. Between a safety zone and the adjacent curb or within twenty feet (20') of a point on the curb immediately opposite the end of a safety zone.
  6. Within twenty feet (20') of any intersection.
  7. At any place where the standing of a vehicle will reduce the usable width of the roadway for moving traffic to less than eighteen feet (18').
  8. Within fifteen (15') of a fire hydrant.
  9. At any place where the vehicle would block the use of a driveway.
  10. Within fifty feet (50') of a traffic signal or the nearest rail of a railroad grade crossing.
  11. On any sidewalk or parkway.
  12. At any place where official signs prohibit parking.

13. In those specific locations identified in Section 9-2-5.

- B. Citations for violation of this Section 9-2-1 may be issued in the following manner: the Police Department of the Village or civilian personnel designated by the Village President shall enforce the parking ordinances. If a violation of any of the parking ordinances is observed, a parking citation shall be written and placed upon the front windshield of the vehicle.
- C. The fact that a vehicle which is parked illegally is registered in the name of a person shall be considered prima facie proof that that person was in control of the vehicle at the time of the violation, and it shall not be a defense that the vehicle was, at the time of the violation, in the control of a family member of the registered owner or that the registered owner had loaned or leased the vehicle to another. This presumption is intended to be used for all parking violations under each and every ordinance of the Village.

#### 9-2-2 PARKING AT CURB

No vehicle shall be parked with the left side of such vehicle next to the curb, and it shall be unlawful to stand or park any vehicle in a street other than parallel with the curb and with the two (2) right wheels within twelve inches (12") of the regularly established curb line, except that upon those streets that have been marked for angle parking, vehicles shall be parked at the angle to the curb indicated by such marks.

#### 9-2-3 VEHICLES FOR SALE

It shall be unlawful to park any vehicle upon any street for the purpose of displaying it for sale, or to park any vehicle upon any business street from which vehicle merchandise is peddled.

#### 9-2-4 SIGNS

The Chief of Police shall cause signs to be posted in all areas where parking is limited or prohibited, indicating such limitations or prohibitions.

#### 9-2-5 PARKING RESTRICTIONS *Amended, 07-08-829, 548*

- A. It shall be unlawful for an owner or possessor of a motor vehicle to park said motor vehicle on Prairie Avenue between Main Street and St. Albans Street, or on Illinois Street between Maple Avenue and Third Avenue for a period of time greater than ten (10) hours.
- B. It shall be unlawful for any person to park a motor vehicle on Main Street within the Village and on the north side of Prairie Avenue between Main Street and Illinois Street in the Village between the hours of 2 A.M. and 6 A.M. between November 1 and April 1 of the following year.
- C. There shall be no parking on McKinley Street from St. Albans Street to Illinois Street from eight o'clock (8:00) A.M. to four o'clock (4:00) P.M. on school days.

- D. There shall be no parking at any time on either side of Price Road between Illinois Route 47 and St. Albans Street.

9-2-6 TOWING *Ord. 1995-96-581*

The Police Department and all members thereof are hereby authorized to remove and tow away or have removed and towed away, any vehicle in violation of this chapter. The owner of the vehicle, as well as the person who caused said to be in violation of this Chapter 2 of Title 9 of the Hebron Municipal Code shall be individually liable for all expenses incurred as a result of towing said vehicle away.

9-2-7 TEMPORARY RESTRICTIONS; SNOW AND PARADE ROUTES *Ord. 23-24-1018*

- A. Snow route; removal risk.

1. An emergency is automatically declared to exist within the Village whenever there is an accumulation of snow and/or ice of two inches or more, at which time it shall be unlawful for any person to park, or allow to remain parked and/or unattended, any vehicle (as defined in the Illinois Vehicle Code 625 ILCS 5/1-100 *et seq.*) or any other item of personal property or material on any improved or paved village street until the streets have been cleared of snow and ice.
2. In addition to the fines provided for in this section, any vehicle (as defined in the Illinois Vehicle Code 625 ILCS 5/1-100 *et seq.*) which is parked in violation of this section may be towed or any other item of personal property or material may be removed and disposed at the discretion of the Police Department. All towing charges and disposal storage fees shall be the responsibility of the owner of the property.
3. Any person violating any provision of this section shall be fined at least \$50 but no more than \$250 for each offense. A vehicle (as defined in the Illinois Vehicle Code 625 ILCS 5/1-100 *et seq.*) which is parked and/or unattended upon an improved or paved village street when there is an accumulation of snow and/or ice of two inches or more shall be prima facie evidence of a violation of this section by the person in whose name the vehicle (as defined in the Illinois Vehicle Code 625 ILCS 5/1-100 *et seq.*) is registered. In addition, any item of personal property or material which is left unattended upon an improved or paved village street directly in front of and on the same side of the street, shall be prima facie evidence of a violation of this section by the abutting property owner when there is an accumulation of snow and/or ice of two inches or more.

- B. No-parking parade route. It shall be unlawful for any vehicle to park on any street within the Village that has been posted as “No Parking” for parade purposes or designated as a detour route during a parade. Any vehicle so parked may, in addition to a fine, be towed at the vehicle owner’s expense.
